The concept of PRN number which is permanent registration number helps in identifying the students easily and sends them the notifications.




Fig. 1. Online admission process (Source: iitms.co.in)

are made easy. With the help of this software the admission process is made simple and this is the secured format for online admission.



### Interpretation:






#### Interpretation:
